Clemson 'Digital Tract' gets a name

Issaqueena Trail development with mix of homes, retail to be called Patrick Square

CLEMSON — After nearly 30 years of being called the Digital Tract, a 175-acre planned development on property for-

merly owned by the Digital Corp. has a new name: Patrick Square.

The development is named for Patrick Calhoun, the father of American statesman John C. Calhoun, developer Mike Chee-

zem told Clemson City Council members and residents at a public hearing Monday on rezoning of the property on Issaqueena Trail at Chapman Hill Road in Clemson.

Only a few residents voiced concerns, mainly about increased traffic.

Chapman Hill Road will be slightly rerouted for a safer 90-degree intersection with Issa-

queena directly across from the entrance to the Camelot subdivision, the developer said. Plans for a traffic signal and turn lanes are in the works, Cheezem said.

Plans include a mix of residential styles from apartments to single-family homes, a "town center," with retail businesses such as a grocery, drugstore and restaurants, and an assisted living facility, Cheezem said.

Homes in the traditional-style community will have front porches, and streets will have sidewalks where people can mingle with neighbors, he said.

"It's all about creating a special sense of place," Cheezem said.

If all goes well through the rezoning and permitting process, work could start by the end of the year, Cheezem said.
